## Go street shopping

When in Hyderabad, go street shopping! While the denizens split their shopping time between the by-lanes of Old Hyderabad and modern day malls, you should head to the city bazaars to soak in the real Hyderabadi culture. Ancient outdoor markets like Laad Bazaar, next to the Charminar, and the nearby Madina Bazaar, offer great local products including traditional embroidery, mirror-work fabric and natural perfumes called ittar. You can browse for **Deccani** Art paintings, Bidri silver-work jewellery and trinkets, lac bangles and pearls. Don't forget to take a look at the traditional Kalamkari textiles and sarees from Pochampally, Mangalgiri and Uppada.



Today, Deccani, Urdu and Telugu mix to form a tongue that is uniquely Hyderabadi. With teahouses serving sweet milky chai and bakeries selling Karachi biscuits, the city is a delicious mix of Hindu and Muslim cultures.

Hyderabad also used to be twinned with Secunderabad, an erstwhile British cantonment. Separated by the Hussain Sagar Lake, Secunderabad is now considered a part of Hyderabad, despite its different culture and history.

The city, now colloquially called Cyberabad, is also an IT hotspot, attracting companies and young engineers from the world over. Huge malls, clubs, sleek lounges, restaurants and throngs of people from all over India populate the new city, making it vibrant and buzzing all year long.

### **Old Hyderabad**


With narrow, crowded lanes and historical spots like the Charminar as well as ancient bazaars, Old Hyderabad is a fount of bargains and delicious cuisines.

#### **Uptown Hyderabad**
